HSL General Membership Meeting Minutes 11/12/25

Meeting called to order by Alyssa Lehr at 7:08pm.

Welcome:

Alyssa welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Guest Speakers:

- Mrs. Williams and Ms. Alba, both fourth grade teachers at LES, were present to discuss the Reading Olympics.
 - Reading Olympics is a county-wide reading incentive program that runs from 4-12th grade.
 - This is Mrs. Williams' 18th year coaching a Reading Olympics team; initially each team had to read 60 books total and today it is down to 25 books.
 - Each year 5 new books are added.
 - The elementary team is made of 4th-6th graders.
 - The lowest reading level book for the competition is 2nd grade and the highest reading level is 7th grade.
 - Each school runs their teams differently.
 - Students need to read a total of 8 books (about 1 book every 3 weeks); students begin to read in September and the competition is not until March or April.
 - Students are asked questions on the books they've read at the Competition, so students learn to take notes on the books they read.
 - The competition has 3 rounds of questions (25 questions per round); the competition is now offered in person, where another team is in the room with your team, or virtually.
 - LES has competed virtually since Covid due to the fact most competitions are not nearby.
 - Enough questions are asked to give every team the chance to win a top ribbon (a Blue Ribbon).
 - All the students seem to really love Reading Olympics! It's a great experience and the students really enjoy cheering their teammates on.
 - To be on the Reading Olympics team, each participating student must read a book by a certain deadline;
 this year 20 students signed up for the Reading Olympics, but 8 did not read their first book in time, so the team is down to 12 members.
 - Mrs. Williams and Ms. Alba thanked the HSL for supporting the Reading Olympics.
- Mr. John Hughes, LES Counselor
 - Mr. Hughes explained all the roles he is involved in at LES:
 - He tries to be present with all students and visit all classrooms multiple times a year.
 - He helps Dr. Bignotti with all High Five Assemblies.
 - He talks with teachers to find out what the needs are in each classroom.
 - He will then talk with parents and staff to find the best support systems for students.
 - He does individual check-ins with students and small groups.
 - He coordinates 504 plans for students.
 - This is Mr. Hughes' 18th year as a counselor.
 - Mr. Hughes loves watching the kids grow at LES from Kindergarten to Fourth Grade.
 - He is always trying to find new approaches and new directions to help our students.
